| DECISION | APPROVED That the Leader of the Council and Cabinet Member for Finance: 1) Approved the allocation of £60,000 from the S106 contribution held by the Council at E/116/345C, to be used towards upgrading the lighting system at Breakspear Crematorium to LED to improve energy efficiency; and 2) Approved the allocation of £33,000 from the S106 contributions held by the Council at E/116/345C (£21,000) and PPR/104/355B (£12,000), to be used towards upgrading the lighting system at Charville Lane Children's Home to LED to improve energy efficiency. |
| Reason for decision | The allocation of S106 and Section 278 (S278) funds is required to be formally approved by the Leader of the Council and the Cabinet Member for Finance on a case-by-case basis. |

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| Alternative options considered and rejected | Consideration was given to the partially built site and it was considered to complete in favour of the proposed scheme which has housing benefits for residents. |
