### Decision made

<b>Cabinet Members making the decision</b>	Councillor Jonathon Bianco – Cabinet Member for Property and Infrastructure Councillor Eddie Lavery – Cabinet Member for Environment, Housing and Regeneration
<b>DECISION</b>	<b>APPROVED</b>  That the Cabinet Member for Property and Infrastructure and the Cabinet Member for Environment, Housing and Regeneration, authorised the grant of an extension for the relevant period of 90 years to the existing leasehold interests as outlined in this report in accordance with the provisions of the Leasehold Reform, Housing and Urban Development Act 1993.
<b>Reasons for decision</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Once a formal Notice is served on the Council under the Leasehold Reform, Housing and Urban Development Act 1993, the Council is bound to comply with the provisions and timescales in the Act. The Council will need to negotiate the premium to be paid by the leaseholder for an extension of the term for a further 90 years in each case.</li><li>2. Once the Counter Notice is served by the Council, this triggers the negotiations for the premium payable for the lease extension. In the event that a premium cannot be agreed, the Act provides for a tribunal to consider and fix the price to be paid.</li></ol>
<b>Alternative options</b>	There is no option but to comply with the Act and grant an extension to the lease in each case or sale of freehold.
