<b>Decision</b>	<b>Approved</b>  <b>That the Cabinet Member for Residents' Services and the Cabinet Member for Finance agreed to the capital release request of £83k from the CCTV Programme 2023/24 budget for the camera replacement programme (Appendix A).</b>
<b>Reason for decision</b>	The CCTV strategy for 2023/24 includes replacement cameras on the 5-year planned programme due to existing cameras being 5 years old and reaching the end-of-life cycle. The replacement programme primarily targets the main town and village centres, where statistically there is more crime.
<b>Alternative options considered and rejected</b>	Officers considered not replacing the cameras; however, this would lead to system unreliability and possible failure of cameras impacting on evidence gathering capabilities for the Council and Police.
