	That the Cabinet Member for Finance and the Cabinet Member for Property, Highways and Transport: 1) Accepted the tender and approve the award of contract for Lift Refurbishment of 2No. Centre Core Passenger Lifts & 1no Goods Lift at Civic Centre, Uxbridge Corporate stock to Professional Lift Services Ltd at a cost of £364,860.00; and 2) Agreed to the capital release requests of £438k from the Civic Centre Transformation Lift Refurbishment Programme 2023/24 capital budget for Lift Refurbishment of 2No. Centre Core Passenger Lifts and 1No Goods Lifts at Civic Centre Uxbridge.
Reason for decision	Lift condition surveys were undertaken by Frankhams RMS Consultancy, and these identified a number of deficiencies with the passenger and goods lifts in the Civic Centre. With the successful refurbishment of 5No Passenger Lifts, 3No within Phase 1 and 2No. within Phase 2, the remaining two passenger lifts within centre Core have been taken out of service due to reliability and passenger safety concerns and form Phase 3 along with Phase 4. The Good Lifts requires upgrading to

	ensure it meets current Loller Regulations and to improve reliability.
	Officers procured the works via open tender and the "most economically advantageous tender" received was from Professional Lift Services Limited, who provided the most competitive price received, and were compliant in all respects of the contract specification and requirements.
