The governing bodies of local authority-maintained schools must be constituted in accordance with regulation 13 The School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012. There is no upper limit on the size of governing bodies, and they may appoint as many co-opted governors as they consider necessary. The number of

co-opted governors who are eligible to be elected or appointed as staff governors must not, when counted with the one staff governor and the headteacher, exceed one-third of the total membership of the governing body. There must be a minimum of 2 parent governors.
