	That the Cabinet Member for Planning, Housing & Growth:
	 Considered the five objections to the proposed parking restrictions, as detailed within the body of the report;
	2. In consideration of the overarching benefits to the access of the U3 bus in the area, instructed officers to proceed with the implementation of the double yellow lines at the junction of Rowan Road and Wise Lane;
	3. In consideration of the objections by residents, agreed NOT to proceed with the single yellow line timed restriction on Laurel Lane and Rowan Road; and
	4. Instructed officers to advise residents to consider a petition, should they wish, for a parking management scheme to be considered for the area.
Reason for decision	The recommendations set out in this report allow improved access to the buses but removes the installation of the single yellow line restriction which was not supported by residents due to concerns over where they would park their vehicles for the one hour time slot per day and that they felt the parking situation on their road was getting better.
